



Next Generation of Polar Researchers Leadership Symposium

SUMMARY

The newest generation of polar-focused researchers will need a strong foundation of interdisciplinary approaches to understand the rapid changes in polar regions. The Next Generation Polar Research Conference (NGPR-3) is designed to train and network early career polar researchers for interdisciplinary research careers. This week-long symposium will be held at the University of Southern California's Wrigley Marine Science Center on Catalina Island, CA and will provide an important opportunity for training to foster communication, team-building and leadership skills with a focus on the development of interdisciplinary research. Participants from disciplines spanning the natural, physical and social sciences will be competitively selected to participate in dynamic networking opportunity with plenary talks, special sessions, poster sessions and professional development training.



COSTS

Room and board are included. Participants can apply for additional funds to help defray costs of travel.

SYMPOSIUM SIZE AND TARGET AUDIENCE

34 early career scientists (i.e., within 5 years of Ph.D.) from the fields of atmospheric science, marine ecosystems, limnology, ice science, terrestrial ecosystems, geosciences, policy, economics or other related fields will be competitively selected to attend the conference. The conference will also be attended by senior Polar researchers from a variety of professions.
